Game Bird Shipment From Canada Fails

First efforts to secure ptarmigan in Saskatchewan province for transfer to Michigan's upper peninsula have met with failure.

The conservation department has been informed that the birds in an original shipment of between 40 and 50 ptarmigan were dead on arrival at Prince Albert, Saskatchewan. The birds had been shipped by trappers.

The conservation commission last November approved spending \$2,500 for purchase of 200 ptarmigan and costs of transportation with the hope that the birds could be successfully introduced into the upper peninsula. The department has been searching for some time for another game bird that can withstand the rigors of northern Michigan winters.
