He served as Farmington chairman of the American Red Cross Drive in 1947 and served as treasurer to numerous other community and charitable drives and campaigns.

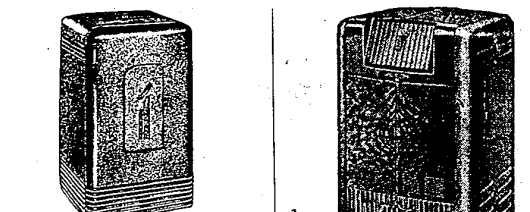
