Sheehan made his confession to State Police after admitting he and seven other robbers. He was shot by Gene Newson, 18, a clerk at the Evergreen Pharmacy, on January 18.

Sheehan told police that after leaving the Evergreen Pharmacy he went down 10 Mile Road to Lahser, turned south on Lahser to Eight Mile Road and westward to Middlebelt Road to Middlebelt. It was while he was on Eight Mile Road, somewhere between Middlebelt and Grand River, that he discarded the Army battle jacket, of olive drab, which is believed to be bloodstained from his wounds in the stomach. Sheehan admitted that the \$100 he got as loot from the pharmacy was taken from the jacket pocket. A little further on, he told police, he discarded the gun, a .32 blue-stamped automatic of foreign make.

Sheehan admitted that after discarding the jacket and gun he went on to his home near Five Mile River and Merriman Roads, where he changed his shoes. He then left his house and hitch-hiked a ride. Near Five Mile River he was picked up by a young man driving an old car, whom he told he would give \$10 if he would drive him to West Jefferson and Pulsatki, in Detroit. He explained that he was sick. The driver of the car took him to the designated spot, where Sheehan got out. Police later picked him up as he was staggering along the sidewalk. They arrested him for questioning after finding he was wounded.

Both the Farmington Police and Michigan State Police are now desirous of obtaining the jacket and gun which Sheehan discarded. It is believed that children, or some passerby, may have seen one or both of the items and kept the discovery a secret for fear of reprisals. The police, however, desire the items as evidence in the case against Sheehan.

Also, they seek further knowledge of the young driver who gave Sheehan a "lift" to Jefferson and Pulsatki, in the hope of checking Sheehan's whereabouts during the night of January 18.

Anyone having knowledge of the fact or any fact, as well as knowing who gave him the ride while hitch-hiking, is asked to get in touch with the police.

**750 SCHOLARSHIPS
PART OF NEW PLAN
OFFERED BY MSC**

Approximately 625 scholarships for high school and junior college students throughout the state of Michigan will be made available this year through a new scholarship program at Michigan State College.

The program, to be effective immediately, was approved February 10 at the regular meeting of the State Board of Agriculture, governing body of the college. Five grants of \$100 each will be made for the 1949-50 college year according to Prof. Arthur J. Clark, chairman of MSC's scholarship committee.

Of this total, 625 are earmarked for qualified high school seniors, one for each Michigan high school on the approved list of the State Department of Public Instruction, and an additional 100 "at large" will be granted to students with available for junior college scholarships on the basis of one scholarship for every 200 junior college students. The scholarship plan was patterned after those in effect at other state-supported institutions.

The scholarships will cover total course fees at MSC, and may apply for four years if the student maintains a specified scholastic average, Clark said. Basic requirements for the grants will be honor scholastic average and financial need.

The scholarship plan, Prof. Clark pointed out, is designed to provide opportunity of a higher education for outstanding high school graduates who might not be financially able to attend college.

This new program will replace the Michigan State scholarship plan which for a number of years has made available 64 scholarships for the state of Michigan.

**MSC Receives \$8,650
In Grants And Gifts**

Gith and grants totaling \$8,650 were received for Michigan State College by the State Board of Agriculture on February 10, according to Karl H. McDonel, secretary of the board.

The largest grant, \$3,000, from Paul Mellon of Upperville, Va., will be used by the botany and plant pathology department for further research on the nutrition and composition of pasture grasses.

Other grants were received from the Research Corporation of New York City, the American Cynamid Company, the New York City Parks Department, and Company, Detroit, Albert H. Case, Tampa, Florida, and C. S. Force of Kalamazoo.
