### Dog Owners Are Warned Of '49 License Deadline

Oakland County dog owners were reminded this week that the county dog licenses for 1949 are now available at all townships (except Farmington), and can be obtained without payment of penalty up to March 1.

All dogs three months of age or older must be licensed, said W. D. Atkins, Oakland County animal commissioner.

Fees for licenses are \$1 for males, \$2 for females, and \$1 for unsexed animals.

### Lake Trout Planting Planned For Sport

The planting of legal-size and fingerling trout, carried out last fall on Michigan's trout lakes in preparation for the spring fishing season, is for the immediate sport they will provide and not essentially for reproduction purposes.

The survival rate is low, even under the most favorable circumstances, reminds A. E. Hazzard, director of the conservation department's institute for fisheries research.

Lake environment is not conducive to egg development in the case of brook, brook or rainbow trout. Fresh oxygen-carrying water is a prime requisite, and trout will leave lake waters during the spawning season when access to streams is possible.

Banding of a number of Michigan's wintering ducks as a means of determining survival rates and migration routes is in progress now. Over 200 waterfowl already have been captured and released from the Pte. Mouillie marsh area, and as many as 2,000 more are scheduled to be live-trapped for the same purpose by Robert Benson, game biologist of the conservation department.

This year particular emphasis is being placed on studying survival and migration routes of diving ducks.
