We got strictly fresh grade "A" medium eggs fer 49c a dozen. The bacon to go with 'em is 45c a lb. if you want it sliced and 23c a lb. if you just want it square. Didn't cha ever hear of bacon squares??

Could we interest yuh in 1/4 lb. bulk dried beef or 1 lb. of pork sausage? Either of 'em is both the same low price of 33c. While we're dickerin' with these low figures we gotta tell you about some shank ends of smoked hams we got here. You can have as much as 6 lbs. for 39c lb. You can bake it — boil it — or hang it in the basement. There's a string on it. No strings on this 1c dog food sale, tho.
