Civic Players Score Again

Under the direction of Arne Boesen, the Detroit Civic Players again presented one of the American classics. This time it was Louisa M. Alcott's "Little Women". The play was given under the auspices of the Detroit Women's City Club on February 15.

The entire action of the play takes place in the sitting-room of the March home in Concord, Massachusetts, in the winter of 1863. Because of the many different situations in the original book, the audience was given only the general idea of the story.

Mr. Boesen did very well in his selection of the cast. For the four March "Little Women" he chose Benita Hart as the tom-boyish but sensible Jo; Patricia Powers as Beth, the frail music loving sister; Luana Lee as Amy, the somewhat selfish artist of the family; Dolphine Niemi as Meg, the "big sister" of the household; Eldora Best, Marmae's mother; Thelma Schultz, Aunt March (their wealthy aunt).

The one and only choice male role went to Henry Makoski as Laurie, Jo's sweetheart. The character part was performed by Julia Magary, who played Hannah, the kindly servant. Arne Boesen took George Harwood's place as the girl's father.

The smallness of the City Club limited the use of scenery; however, the cast turned in a fine performance. R. G.

777'S SET NEW RECORD IN FALCON LEAGUE

Alleys five and six were red hot at Farmington Recreation Thursday as the 777's exploded for a 621 series. This was the highest team series for one game bowled in the Falcon League this year.

Dick Wheeler paced this outburst with a 201 game. He is the third bowler to reach the 200 mark in league competition this year. Other team members contributed the following to the record series: Bill O'Connor, 135; Leonard Desmelik, 120; and Fred Allen 165.

Despite this phenomenal second game the 777's were held to two points by the last place Hot Shots. The Hot Shots displayed steady bowling to take the first and third games but lost the second game and total pins.

Dick Deam led his team with a 512 series. His 190 game, which came in the third game, was second highest of the day.

By taking only two points from the Hot Shots, the 777's blew a golden opportunity to regain first place. The leading Pin Kings were held to one point by the surprising Alley Cats. This shaved their lead to two points over the 777's and Foxy Flops; who are tied for second place.

Albert Zystek led the Alley Cats in this upset victory over the league leaders, while Bill Gardner had the highest average for the Pin Kings. Gardner did not arrive in time to bowl the first game, and this contributed to the 137 pin defeat absorbed by the Kings. It seems that everybody picks on the Gutterboys. The latest team to take advantage of this "soft touch" was the Foxy Flops. Bill Goers paced his team with a 450 series, while Ken Siler was high man for the Gutterboys.

With five weeks of bowling left, the 777's and Foxy Flops bowl the deciding series of the year next Thursday. These two teams are tied for second place at this time, but a decisive defeat will virtually eliminate the loser from the race.

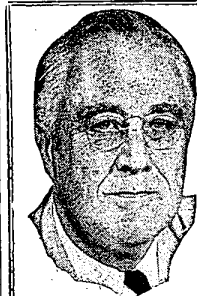
