CARE Reduces Prices Of Lard Shipments

The CARE committee, engaged in transporting and distributing parcels of food for the needy in certain European countries, has reduced the cost of ten-pound shipments of lard from this country to European recipients.

The reduction of 75 cents per

10 pound package reflects the drop in cost of the commodity in the open market, and CARE has reduced its price accordingly.

The organization also revealed that it has negotiated a renewal of its contract to provide the service it has carried on in Czechoslovakia.

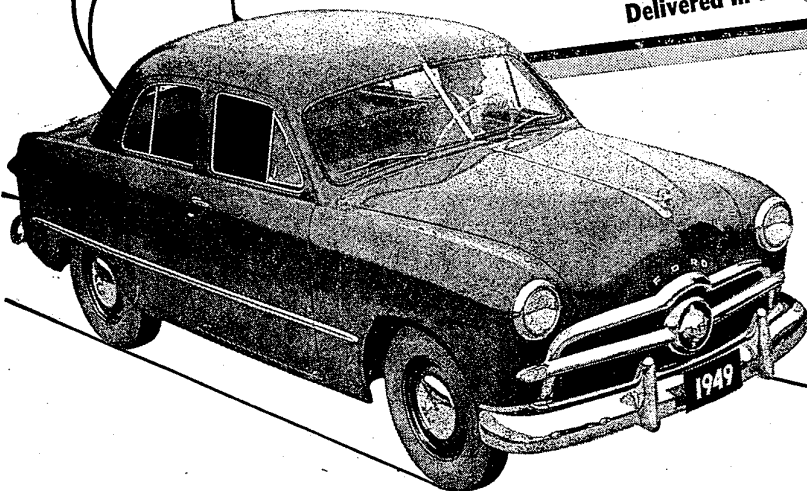
