CREDIT NEEDS FOR FARMINGTON HIGH STUDENTS LISTED

Numerous questions are being asked daily about the number of hours credit required for grade classification. So — for those who are interested — a student is credited for high school from the ninth grade through the twelfth, which consists of four school years, or 160 semester hours of credit.

The following standards govern the classification of high school students, the hours of credit being computed at the beginning of the school year. To enter the ninth grade, the student must have completed the eighth grade from an accredited school. To be classified as a sophomore he must have 30 to 69 hours of accredited work; a junior, 70 to 109 hours; a senior, 110 or more hours.

The required units necessary for graduation from Farmington High School are 16 units (a unit consisting of 10 semester hours). Included in these units must be the following courses: English (3 units); American History (1 unit); American Government (1 unit); Physical Education - boys (1 unit) and girls (1 unit). (Boys are required to take Physical Education every year they are in high school.)

The normal subject load for a student, from two to two and one-half hours a semester. No variation from these limits shall be allowed except by special arrangement.
