**CHARTER GRANTED NEW V. F. W. POST IN CLARENCEVILLE**

At a special meeting on March 15, the new Geary-Lint Post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Clarenceville was activated when State Inspector General James A. Tribbey, in a special ceremony, presented the group with its charter. Forty-eight members of the new post were present.

Inspector General Tribbey instructed the new members of the post on the aims of the V.F.W., and what the organization stands for. At the following business meeting, nominations for officers were made, and elected as the first officers were Thomas R. Scriber, Commander; James Champagne, Senior Vice Commander; Warren Markle, Junior Vice Commander; Fred Menke, Jr., Quarter Master, and Raymond Geary, Chaplain. Commander Scriber stated that the first aim of the Post for the coming year would be to strive for a new home for the Geary-Lint Post. At the present time, the Post is holding its meetings at Menke's Service Station.

The Post is already planning a social party to be held on April 1. All members, their wives and friends will be invited. Refreshments and entertainment will be included, and committees appointed. Dancing will also be on the program for the event.

At this writing, the new post has 107 members, and the charter is still open. However, it was announced that the charter will be closed on April 1.
