

# SERVICES DEPENI ON STATE FUNDS

Many special services offered by public libraries in Michigan are directly traceable to State Ald funds which last year totaled \$375,000 for the entire State.

These special services offered the residents and public of the state included travellug "bookmobiles" and film libraries of sound films and "documentaries" for loan. Many of these services, all designed to supply the residents of this state with more knowledge, may be forced to discontinue if the 1949 legislature does not make an appropriation to carry on the II-brary work, or en-mark funds for State Aid as in the past. The Michigan Library Association has asked the budget committee for \$1,000,000 for State Aid this year, stading that with such a sum library service would be extended all over the state. If no State Aid is given libraries, 20 libraries in the State will be forced to close their doors, the Association revealed.
