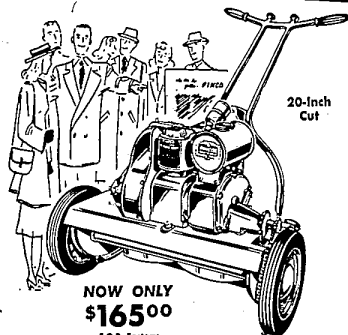

## AUTOS FOR BLIND VETERANS BILL SENT BACK TO COMMITTEE

The well-known bill to provide automobiles for blinded veterans is again before Congress.

Both the House of Representatives and the Senate have referred the blinded veterans auto bill to Committees and it is extremely important that each blinded veteran do his part in urging Congress to pass this measure.

If you are in favor of a law to provide automobiles for blinded veterans, you should immediately write to the Senators and Representatives of your state and ask them to support the "blinded veterans auto bill". It would be helpful if you described to the Congressman your need for an automobile, telling how the car would assist you in your rehabilitation. It would also improve the bill's chance of passage if you explain that a friend or member of your family is available to act as a driver for your car. You may address your Senators at the Senate Office Building, Washington, D. C. and your representatives at the House Office Building, Washington, D. C. If you do not know the Congressman from your state you may write to National Headquarters of the Blinded Veterans Association for their names.

The Congressional Committees which will consider the auto bill are the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs and the Senate Committee on Labor and Public Welfare. Letters to the committee members from blinded veterans and their friends will give the car bill additional support.

In Washington, National Headquarters of the BVA is doing its best to secure passage of the car bill and every letter you write will be valuable.

Elbert D. Thomas, of Utah, is chairman of the U. S. Senate Committee on Labor and Public Welfare and John E. Rankin, of Mississippi is chairman of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

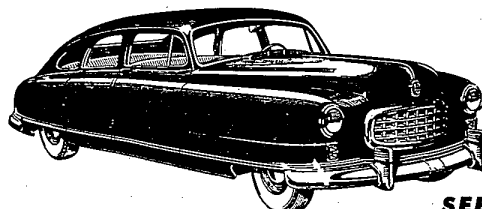
