POLICE TO CHECK SURPLUS RADIOS FOR EXPLOSIVES

Inspection service is now available at each State Police Post to determine whether or not L.P.F. surplus transceivers are equipped with destructor charges.

State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard announced the inspection service.

The destructor charges were placed in the radios to avoid their falling into enemy hands. Such explosives remain a source of danger and could cause serious injury to a person unfamiliar with them. Experimenting with the set, or careless removal of the charges might cause detonation.

Ordinarily destructor charges were detonated by a separate circuit. These circuits are not connected in sets on public sale, consequently the radios are safe for ordinary handling.

All persons making inquiry to the State Police regarding these sets will be advised as to the procedure to follow for handling and inspection.
