Scouts' Camp Agawam Undergoes Remodeling

Camp Agawam, the year-round training camp of the Clinton Valley Boy Scouts, will reopen this summer after a year's lapse in operation while the building and expansion program has been under way.

Camp Agawam is located on Tommys Lake near Lake Orion. It is maintained for the use of all Scouts in the Clinton Valley Council which includes Oakland and Macomb counties.

A budget of \$48,000.00 was set up for the minimum improvements necessary to meet all of the health and safety factors needed for a camp of this size. Many gifts have been received for new construction and the goal is in sight for the completion of the project.

Construction has been under way all winter on the new dining lodge and storage building which is near completion. This building, of cinder block construction, has dining facilities for 225 at one sitting. A large well-organized kitchen will facilitate food handling and serving. A large room is attached to the kitchen. The importance of this fireproof type of construction was demonstrated by the recent fire which destroyed the caretaker's cottage at the camp. Fully covered by insurance, the building will be replaced with a new cinder block cottage for which construction will start immediately.

Other additions and improvements include a new water supply and pumping system, new swimming area and dock, additional boats and canoes, and several Troop Lodges for year round camping. Opening dates for the summer camp will be announced in the near future.

State Warns Buyers
Of Low Grade Grass Seed

Seed dealers and home owners are cautioned that state seed inspection reveals that to date there is an unusual volume of Grade "D" grass seed being shipped in and offered for sale on the Michigan market, reports Charles A. Stahl, State Seed Analyst, Michigan Department of Agriculture.

According to the Michigan grading system, Grade "D" is not recommended for lawns, and therefore should never be purchased by the discriminating buyer. Preliminary tests indicate that a large percentage of this Grade "D" seed is misbranded and does not meet legal requirements.

The state recommends only Grade "A" seed for the discriminating home owner, and Grade "B" when Grade "A" is not available. These two top grades of lawn seed are based on the use of such desirable grasses as Kentucky Bluegrass and Red Fescue.

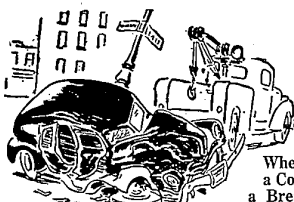
