FEATURE SERIES  
BEGINS ON NEW  
COUNTY HOSPITAL

The dietary department of the new 500-bed Southern Oakland Hos-  
pital to be constructed in this  
area, will take its place beside the  
operating room, the pharmacy, and  
the laboratory, as a powerful weapon  
against disease. Today the physi-  
cian works closely with the dieti-  
tician, just as he does with the sur-  
geon, the pharmacist and the  
technician.

Preparing and serving thou-  
sands of meals a year, including  
many to patients who require spe-  
cial diets, is part of the service  
made available to patients by the  
dietetics department of our modern  
hospitals.

Supervising this great task is  
the dietitian at the hospital. Her  
task is two fold: the preparation  
of diets ordered by physicians, and  
pleasing the palate of sick people  
many of whom are hard to  
please. Doctors declare that she  
is fulfilling the first part of her  
task; and the patients themselves  
praise the food, indicating that she  
also fulfills the second part.

Food sometimes acts as a cur-  
ative agent by supplying certain  
substances, of which the patient  
has a deficiency, that build tissue,  
increase energy and regulate the  
functions of the various organs of  
the body. These substances in-  
clude iron for the blood, calcium  
and phosphorus for the bones, vi-  
tamins for growth, carbohydrates  
and fats for energy and others for  
regulating bodily functions.

Often, food is the ally of the  
physician in checking disease or  
restoring the patient to health. Di-  
etitian to health. Proper diets, well-  
balanced meals, promote recovery  
and generally safeguard the health  
of the patient. Special diets are  
essential in the treatment of such  
ailments as diabetes, Bright's dis-  
ease, liver and gall bladder disor-  
ders and diseases of the digestive  
tract.

In such instances diets are pre-  
scribed by the physician and they  
must be prepared with the most  
exact care both as to quantity and  
constituents. Usually the food is  
weighed to the fraction of an ounce  
and must be eaten entirely by the  
patient to afford maximum bene-  
fit.

To meet the growing needs of  
this community the new Southern  
Oakland Hospital will be construct-  
ed and St. Joseph Mercy Hospital  
will be expanded through the Great-  
er Detroit Hospital Fund. This  
Fund is now beginning a campaign  
to raise \$19,720,000 for hospital  
construction and expansion in  
Greater Detroit.
