

A revised cancer detection program, backed by the Oakland County Medical Society is being offered to the people of Farmington by the American Cancer Society, according to Mrs. Frederick W. Dag-nall, local chairman.

This new program has been carefully worked out to afford examinations to the greatest number of people. Seventy-two doctors in Oakland County, members of the Oakland County Medical Society, are cooperating with the American Cancer Society as well as the Pontiac General and the St. Joseph Mercy Hospitals.

Dr. Robert C. Hersh is chairman of the cancer committee of the Oakland County Medical Society and Mrs. Ted Koella, Jr., is chairman of the cancer detection program for the American Cancer Society.

The American Cancer Society maintains two offices in Oakland County, one at 15 West Huron St., phone 2-5520 in Pontiac, in charge of Mrs. Edwin J. Mahala and the other at 810 N. Main, phone 2-3586 in Royal Oak in charge of Mrs. Helen Laursen.




