State Police Commissioner Leonard Reports On 1948 Accident Toll

A new all-time high in motor vehicle mileage in Michigan in 1948 was accompanied by new highs in total number of accidents and persons injured, but although there were more fatalities than in any year since 1941, the death rate per 100 million miles of travel was the lowest on record.

This information is contained in the annual traffic accident experience report released by State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard.

There was a daily average of four persons killed, 112 injured, and 854 accidents, the totals for the year being as follows: 1,502 deaths as compared with 1,447 in 1947, an increase of 55 or four per cent; 40,392 persons injured as compared with 38,195 in 1947, an increase of 2,697 or seven per cent, and 140,172 accidents as compared with 137,619 the previous year, an increase of 2,553 or two per cent.

Estimated motor vehicle travel exceeded 19.1 billion miles in 1948, the highest on record and nine per cent above 1947. The death rate of 7.56 per 100 million miles of travel was 22 per cent below the 100-year average; and 41 per cent below the 1941 rate.

Motor vehicle registrations climbed 10 per cent to a new high of 2,000,222, and included 1,749,650 passenger cars, 199,567 commercial vehicles and 50,153 farm vehicles.

Incorporated communities accounted for 83 per cent of all accidents, 62 per cent of the injured and 25 per cent of the deaths. Rural areas reported 17 per cent of the accidents, 35 per cent of the injured and 65 per cent of the deaths.

Only three counties, Missaukee, Montmorency and Oshtemo, which had three per cent of the total registered vehicles, had no traffic deaths. Ten counties, with 61 per cent of the registered vehicles, accounted for 844 or 56 per cent of the deaths. Forty per cent of all deaths occurred on Saturdays and Sundays.

In seven out of 10 fatal accidents one or more of the drivers were reported as violating the traffic laws. In addition, of 503 pedestrians killed in 1948, an increase of eight over 1947, seven out of 10 were violating the law or acting unsafely at the time the fifth of the pedestrian fatalities were children.

Vehicle defects were reported in 13 per cent of the fatal accidents. About one-third of the accidents occurred when the weather was cloudy, rainy, snowy, etc., and in almost one out of four the driver's vision was obscured in some manner.

Farm Accidents Cost One Billion

More than a million and a half farm residents took enforced vacations last year due to accidents. In short, one out of every 17 farm people suffered a disabling accident.

Motor vehicle accidents now head the list of causes of fatalities to rural people, 7,300 of whom were killed due to collisions, blow-outs and other highway mishaps in 1948.

The annual economic toll due to all types of farm accidents is now nearly one billion dollars.

In an all-out attempt to reduce these staggering figures, 414 Club members throughout the nation are already engaged in the 1949 National 4-H Farm Safety program, reports Guy L. Noble, director, National Committee on Boys and Girls Club Work.
