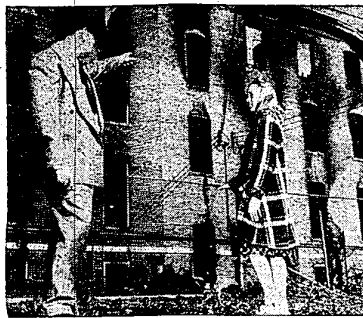

**INFERNO OF DEATH**

EFFINGHAM, ILL. — Little but the walls are left standing after raging flames devoured the interior of St. Anthony's hospital in Effingham, Illinois. ### Pheasant Crop To Be Counted

Hunters who would like to know how many pheasants there will be at their favorite hunting spot next season can make themselves a rough forecast, by counting the number of crowing cock birds there now.

A half-hour before to an hour after sunrise is the best time to count crowing cocks, says R. A. MacNutt, a conservation department pheasant specialist, who is now working with several counting crews in pheasant habitat areas in southern Michigan. After several mornings of counting crowing cocks, the number of same should be averaged and then multiplied by this year's sex ratio of two hens per cock to estimate the number of hens. With a favorable breeding season, the number of roosters available in hunting season should be at least twice the spring count of hens.

"This year we plan to cover up to 30 routes in 22 counties through June," MacNutt said, "in order to get as good an estimate as possible on the breeding potential. On each route our 'crow-counting' crews will stop every mile and listen for two minutes. Crews plan to cover each 20-mile route about five times. April 15 to about May 15 usually is the height of the breeding period."

In six separate areas, observers will make an eye-count to get an estimate of the actual number of birds per acre. Rural mail carriers are also cooperating and have started a spring count of pheasants during the course of their regular runs.

MacNutt pointed out that energetic sportsmen desirous of making their own personal surveys of the number of crowing cocks should look for the birds in the open, but near cover. Taking a count at dusk in the evening will serve the purpose for those not interested in getting up so early. When all is quiet, a slamming car door sometimes will provoke a challenging response from the birds.
