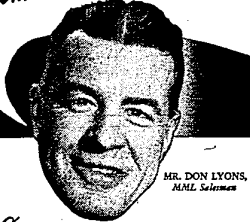

There is not one that even approaches it.

A number of legislative bills have been introduced, and now are in process of legislative consideration, which would abolish state services outright. Governor Williams has said repeatedly that the state government, for the most part, was efficiently run and that he saw no need to eliminate state services. He would retain them, amplify them to meet new needs, and then balance the budget by imposing new taxes. The corporations tax, he feels, would be an indirect burden on the taxpayer at the most.

The State Senate has reversed an old policy of secret sessions for confirmation of appointments by the governor. This change was sponsored by Sen. Colin L. Smith (Big Rapids) who said newspaper correspondents should have access to senate debate instead of having to rely on secondhand reports of what had been said.

Now that the April election is out of the way, the legislature may be counted on to clear the decks fairly quickly of important bills. Weeks have been devoted to study of these measures. Only the voters' verdict of April 4 was needed to break the log jam.

**George S. McIntyre
New State Forester**

Appointment of George S. McIntyre as state forester is announced by conservation director P. J. Hoffmaster.

Succeeding Marcus Schaaf as chief of the conservation department's forestry division, McIntyre assumes charge of 3,600,000 acres embraced in Michigan's 22 state forests. Schaaf retired March 31 after 35 years of state service. McIntyre became assistant state forester in March, 1929, after five years of service with the Old Land Economic Survey that appraised cutover land in both Michigan peninsulas.

A native of Iowa, McIntyre was graduated from Iowa State College with a bachelor of science degree in forestry. He is a senior member of the Society of American Foresters and a World War I veteran.

As state forester, McIntyre will supervise state forests and nurseries and the department's expanding program of cooperation with commercial forest and farm woodland owners.
