The spring aerial survey of waterfowl by conservation department game men in southwestern Michigan indicated nearly a 25 per cent increase in geese and ducks. Waterfowl also were spotted, in large numbers in the river marshes, Allegan county. A few swan were noted in the major goose concentration areas.
