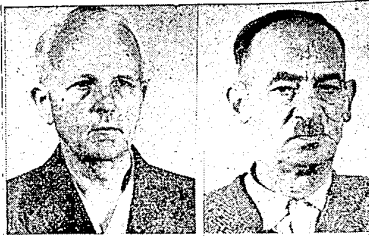


TOP NAZIS SENTENCED



KUERNBERG, GERMANY — These high-echelon Nazis were found guilty by U. S. War Crimes Court. The charges accused them of helping Hitler plan and wage his wars of conquest. (Top left to right) Baron Ernst von Weizsaecker, former Ambassador to the Vatican and State Secretary to the Foreign Office, received a sentence of seven years; Wilhelm Koppler, former State Secretary to the Foreign Office and Economic Advisor, received 10 years; bottom (left to right) Ernest Woermann, Foreign Office official, Ambassador to China and Consul to London, seven years; and Hans Lammer, Chief of the Reichsbank, received a sentence of 20 years.
