

**Poultry Contest Deadline Nears**

A chance for Michigan poultrymen to again enter the search for the "chicken-of-tomorrow" has been announced by J. M. Moore, extension poultryman at Michigan State College.

One hundred day-old chicks is the official entry. The chicks are banded and started on their 12-week rearing period. A meaty, high-egg producing chicken is the goal of the contest.

Deadline for entries has been set as April 23, 1949. Information can be obtained from the Poultry Department, Michigan State College, East Lansing.

A record-breaking total of 14,587 students have enrolled for the spring quarter at Michigan State College.

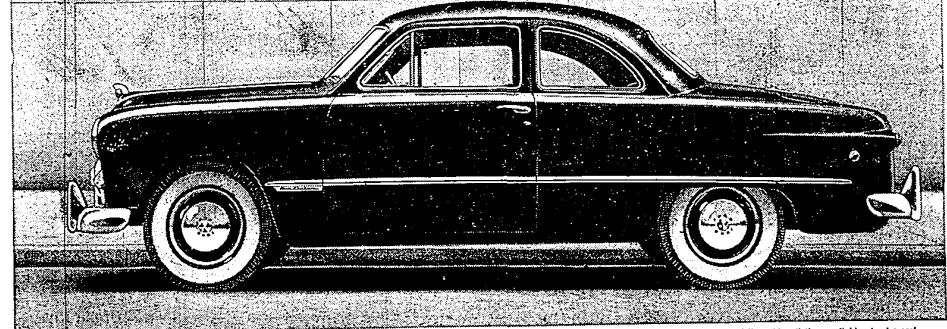
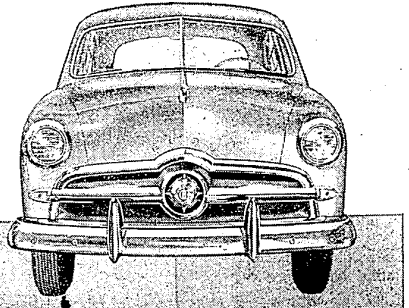
The figure exceeds by 609 the previous spring enrollment record of 13,978 set last year, according to Registrar Robert S. Linton.
