**Fire Damages Drive-In Stand**

Fire damaged the roof of the "Ten Grand" drive-in hamburger stand last Wednesday morning. The stand is located at the corner of the Cut-Off and Grand River.

L. C. Dennis, proprietor of the establishment, said the fire started in the wiring. Quickly checked by the Farmington Fire Department, called to the scene by neighbors in the area, the fire managed to burn ceiling cabinets and roof joists before it was extinguished. Damage to the stand is estimated by Dennis and Fire Chief Leo Hendryx as between five hundred and a thousand dollars. Dennis said the building was fully covered by insurance.

The stand, scheduled to open this Saturday, will now be closed for an additional two weeks. During this time, new cabinets, joists and roof boards will be installed and the entire building painted.

At the time of the fire's outbreak, Dennis was not on the premises. He arrived at work in the morning to see the Farmington Fire Department hard at work extinguishing the blaze.

The fire provided another work-out for the new Farmington Township fire truck. The fog unit put out the fire in less time with less water than the older truck could have, according to Fire Chief Hendryx.

Fortunately, all movable fixtures and equipment were removed from the building last fall. Otherwise damage would have been much higher. The equipment was to go in the day of the fire.

**Strawberry Insect Control Explained**

Spittle bug control on strawberries is important, says Ray L. James, extension specialist in entomology at Michigan State College. For control, he recommends the use of one pound of actual chlordane to the acre. No greater amount should be used. To avoid danger of off-flavored fruit, chlordane should not be used after the first berries are three-eighths of an inch in diameter.

When there is doubt about the use of chlordane, farmers may use rotenone. County agricultural agents can give advice on its use.


