If you'd like to put up a \$15,000 home, go ahead. But don't be disappointed if someone builds a factory (or a pigsty) next door.

It all this sounds a little preposterous, better do what we did; take a short tour of our township. According to Dr. John R. Vos, all the above is possible, and probable, because the township has absolutely no zoning ordinance or building code. Anyone can build, dump, or drain whatever or wherever he or she wants to.

All this was graphically illustrated to a representative of the Farmington Enterprise Friday morning, as guest of Dr. Vos on a guided tour of Farmington Township. (Dr. Vos, it may be remembered, bitterly assailed the township board at the beginning of its recent meeting. He claimed the board had failed to assist and support his efforts to rectify unsanitary conditions.)

Covering a relatively small area, we saw many cases of promiscuous dumping, we saw children playing in rat and disease filled dumps, we saw well-maintained homes that have lost their value because of the shoddy construction of houses and factories going up nearby. We saw inexcusable, negligent filth.

And we wondered how long it would be before an epidemic would strike, or before property values in the township would sink to the vanishing point; how long it would be before the township citizens took action.

One of the first places on our tour was a small food shop. The proprietor, his wife, and several children live in the building next to it. There is no running water; a chemical toilet supplies needed "sanitation". Here Dr. Vos explained no licensing or inspection of buildings is required in the township.

Further on, we came to a large dump not ten feet from US Highway 16. Here a small stream was choked by an accumulation of trash & children's tricycle stood in the middle of the stream valley. Tin cans and garbage littered the sides.

True, a small, very small "no dumping" sign was placed well on the side of the dump. But the sign didn't remove the filth; nor has it stopped the dumping.

Just as we were about to leave, a small dump, probably 12 years old, walked down to the stream and dipped out a can full of water. He told us he wanted to "put out" the fire in a burning rubbish heap.

On another side road, several "houses" were under construction, from bits and pieces of all materials. In the center of the hazardous building stood a new, sparkling white, modern home. Dr. Vos estimated the value of the home in five years to be \$2500, its present value is \$3,000.

We stopped here and then to take pictures to show the rest of Farmington what their township is like. In one case, a child was playing on the edge of a pit, dug to contain a septic tank, but actually holding a septic tank's contents. Another time we snapped children playing in their front yard, 50 yards from where a leaking septic tank was bubbling up, spewing its filth over the ground.

Such were the sights we saw. These were not just isolated cases; there are many, many more scattered over a great area.

And they will not cure themselves. The situation will not improve by itself. It will be improved, however, when the people living in Farmington Township decide to do something about the place in which they live.
