

**New Placement Man For Seasonal Farm Labor**

Herbert T. Baynes of Clarkston has been appointed Seasonal Farm Placement Specialist by the Michigan State Employment Service to assist Oakland County farmers with their labor needs.

While the State Employment Service had included farm placement service since its beginning, farm placement was handled by the Michigan State College Extension Service (Emergency Farm Labor Program) during the war and returned to the Employment Service on January 1, 1945.

Mr. Baynes comes well prepared for this work, having lived in Oakland County for 25 years, owning his own farm at Clarkston. He is the oldest member of the Oakland County Farm Bureau and a director for 12 years, is president of the Lapeer-Oakland Farm Loan Association, and has served as a board member for the FHA for the past 3 years.

His last job was as Veterans Counselor at Pontiac City Counciling Center, which he held for 12 years. He has been active in Veterans affairs, holding several offices in veterans organizations.

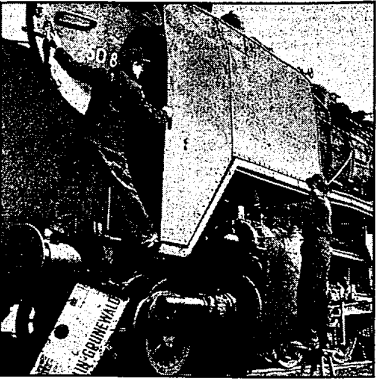
