## Students Learn Anesthesia



Pictured here is an instructor demonstrating the use of a gas machine to a group of students at a Detroit hospital. The modern anesthetist has a choice of injecting one of a variety of drugs spinally, intravenously or intramuscularly to afford maximum safety and comfort to the patient. Up-to-date scientific facilities at St. Joseph Mercy (Pontiac) and many other Detroit hospitals will be expanded through the Greater Detroit Hospital Fund now beginning a campaign for \$19,720,000 to enlarge ten hospitals in Greater Detroit and to help build four new ones in the area, including the Southern Oakland Hospital.

"Let me tell you about my operation."

If your friend had an operation years ago, he may still like to talk about it, but his story probably now has little except historical interest. He cannot tell you what to expect if you are planning an operation. Times and techniques have changed, and your experiences will probably be much different.

For one thing the technique of administering anesthetics has changed. Possibly a gas was placed over your friend's face and the surgeon's assistant poured ether from a bottle over this cone to put him to sleep.

But for your operation, the surgeon and anesthetist in consultation will decide which of many anesthetics is best for you for this particular operation. You may be put to sleep with some anesthetic gas which was unknown a quarter of a century ago and came into general use only recently. Or an anesthetic agent may be injected into the spinal canal for certain operations. By this method you become insensible to pain although wide awake.

Years ago the actual anesthetic drugs and gases to put the patient to sleep, or make him insensible to pain, there are many new drugs which make period of anesthesia and recovery both safer and more comfortable for the patient. These agents are always readily available during all operations in a well-equipped hospital.

In another important respect your experience will differ from the experience of a patient who had a similar operation years ago. You will probably remain in bed about half as long as he did.

The practice of "early ambulation" as it is called, probably originated in Detroit or at least was practiced here before it was generally adopted throughout the nation. It has been found that patients who get out of bed soon after their operations recover much more rapidly than late risers.

One doctor explains it in these words: "Early risers suffer less from gas pains, nausea and weakness than those who remain in bed. Kidney function returns to normal more quickly, and these patients need less than half of the pain-relieving drugs previously administered after operations. They eat and sleep well, and weakness after operation is largely eliminated. All in all, they are able to return to their work and social activities in less than half the time heretofore required."

If you are admitted to a modern,

well-equipped hospital, you are fortunate compared to your friend who had an operation years ago. Your stay will be probably shorter and more comfortable than his was. But unless hospital facilities in Southern Oakland County are increased, you may not be able to get into a good hospital when you need an operation, or you may have to travel a long distance. The Greater Detroit Hospital Fund was organized to assemble funds to enlarge ten existing hospitals including St. Joseph Mercy in Pontiac and help build four new ones including a 200-bed hospital in Southern Oakland County.

Senators Vandenberg wanted to report the important question of whether the pact was just another old-fashioned military alliance or a genuine instrument of collective security. He pointed out that the U. N. charter recognizes the right of nations to "collective self-defense" in case of attack.

The charter, however, adds in Article 51: "Measures taken by members (of the U. N.) in the exercise of this right of self-defense shall be immediately reported to the security council."

Does this mean, Vandenberg asked, that the treaty nations must report their secret defense plans to the security council—where Russia has easy access? "This was something none of them wanted to do, but Senator Pepper of Florida warned that the pact, itself, promised to abide by the U. N. Charter."

Secretary Acheson explained, however, that the only "measures" we are obliged to report to the security council are whatever measures may be taken jointly—after an armed attack occurs.

arm. The idea of supplying arms seems archaic unless we give them our best bombs and techniques. But if we do that, I am against the whole program.

"The aim of the Atlantic pact is to bring about an atmosphere to make arms unnecessary. If we are not going to teach the processes of peace, we may as well quit now."

Another question raised by several senators, was whether to furnish Europe with American-made arms or help the treaty nations manufacture their own arms. If the United States tries to produce all the armament needed for the allied world, the production and logistic problem, it was argued, would be terrific. But on the other hand, plants built in Europe would be easy prey to the Russians and might be turned against us. No one had a ready answer for this sober question.

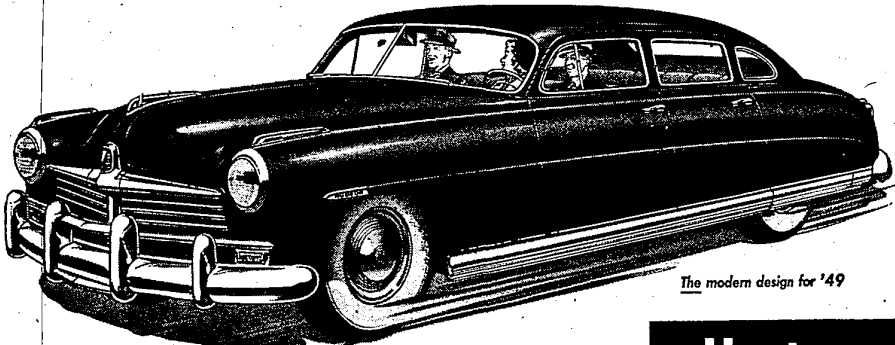
