Geography Returns To C'ville Curriculum

The three Rs—reading, writing and arithmetic—will have their old sidekick, geography, back with them in Clarenceville school curriculum at the high school level.

Geography was withdrawn from the course offerings about 12 years ago, said Supt. of Schools David McDowell. Its comeback is the result of an

"enthusiastic" recommendation from the social studies department.

Titled "The Concept of Geography," the class will complete the social studies department offerings and meet the needs of students who are searching for a high school geography class, explained high school principal Ray Renbarger.

Basically, it hasn't changed much in its 12-year absence. It's still geared to help students acquire knowledge and understanding of the physical makeup of the world—with map study still a vital part of the course content, said Renbarger.

At the same time, Clarenceville school board members also approved a revision of the American literature course. The change will require all 10th graders to take the first semester of the class. In the second semester, however, they will have to be able to pick one of three courses that will be offered.
