

# Local Schools Exhibit At LIT

Three area schools will be among those entering science fair exhibits for the open house program March 17-18 at Lawrence Institute of Technology, Southfield.

The entire campus will be filled with exhibits by regional Science Fair students and LIT students.

There will also be 370 exhibits of regional science fair exhibits from southern Oakland County high school and elementary students.

Among the schools represented will be: Birney Junior High, Thompson Junior High and Yeshiva Beth Yehudah High in South-

field; Our Lady of Mercy High and Dunklel Junior High in Farmington; and Frost Junior High in Livonia.

The Science Fair entries will be on three floors of the LIT Science Building. The campus is located at E-696 and W. 10 Mile in Southfield.

The open house begins at 11 a.m. both days and will end at 9 p.m. Saturday and 6 p.m. Sunday. Admission is free.

The LIT program will include 200 exhibits in architecture, physics, chemistry, engineering, industrial management and mathematics.

# S'craft Reports On Apprentices

An informational program entitled "What's New in Apprenticeship" has been scheduled by Schoolcraft College for 6 p.m. on April 6.

The hour-long program will be conducted by Ronald J. Monfette, director of apprenticeship and related instruction for industry. It is for employers, employees, and returning veterans who have an interest in the industrial apprenticeship program offered by the college.

Monfette has invited local high school guidance counselors to attend the session. They have also been encouraged to identify persons among recent graduates from their schools who would be

good candidates for both employment opportunities and for apprenticeship training.

At present, Schoolcraft has about 350 apprentices enrolled in its related instruction program. The college serves more than 200 manufacturing and other service-oriented companies, 120 of which are located within the college district. Related instruction is offered in 23 different occupational trades.

The "What's New" program will be held in the Applied Science Building on campus. Convenient parking is available in the north parking lot, off Haggerty just south of Seven Mile.

# Final Regional Seminar Tuesday

"Regionalism Toward the Year 2000" will be the discussion topic at the 12th regional governance seminar on Tuesday, March 20, at 8 p.m.

The public seminar, to be held in the Sisson Room, Fair Lane Center at the University of Michigan-Dearborn campus, will mark the completion of a year-long look at the implications and potential of advanced regional governance of metropolitan areas of Michigan (specifically southeastern Michigan).

Dr. Norton E. Long, director for the Center of Community and Metropolitan Studies at the University of Missouri-St. Louis; John Fisher of Harper's; and Dr. Donna Shalala of Columbia University are the authors of the paper to be discussed by the local citizen panel.

Hodges III, assistant vice-president of Michigan Bell Telephone Co. Henry M. Hogan Jr., The Eclectic; Judge Blair Moody Jr., of the Circuit Court; State Rep. Roy Smith (R-Ypsilanti); Dr.

Robert B. Smock, academic coordinator for the University of Michigan-Dearborn; Gerald E. Warren, vice president of the National Bank of Detroit; and a political science student from the University of Michigan-Dearborn campus.
