

Schoolcraft To Hold Seminars For Women

"I Gotta Be Me," a series of informal seminars on the changing roles of women, will be held Tuesday mornings beginning March 20 at Schoolcraft College, 18600 Haggerty, between Six and Seven Mile, Livonia.

Mrs. Nancy Dufour, who heads the women's continuum program at the college, said the seminars are designed to increase awareness of women's roles, past and present, and to define new alternatives for individual life planning.

She will serve as discussion leader for the six sessions the seminar will meet.

The first meeting is at 9:30 a.m., March 20, in Room 3-220 in the Liberal Arts Building. There is no charge for participation, but it is requested that persons telephone Mrs. Dufour to indicate their wish to attend.

Each session will last two hours and participants will be invited to stay for lunch, on

their own, and four the campus.

Five Schoolcraft College students will compose a panel at the first meeting. All are mature women, married and with families, who have returned to school after a period of years.

Their areas of study include botany, liberal arts, library science, mechanical design and medical records. They will discuss the reasons that prompted them to return to college, how the move has affected them and their families, their experiences at Schoolcraft and their career plans.

On Tuesday, March 27, the topic will be "Women and Education." A film strip and discussion will focus on such questions as "Do women naturally choose teaching and home economics while men choose engineering majors?"

Women's groups will be investigating the clinics and advising their friends, she said.

A good clinic will give proper counseling on the procedures and the alternatives to abortion; make sure that the proper blood tests are done if there is an Rh-negative factor involved; an abortion might jeopardize a woman's ability to bear children later; give good follow-up care; and should give contraceptive information.

An "east-meets-west" concert planned March 19 in Nardin Park United Methodist Church in Farmington is part of a world-wide drive of a new Korean hospital.

Coming into the picture is a Korean woman's university, founded by Methodist missionaries, seven musicians from its staff and a Korean-born Farmington mother of four.

The women also have a performance scheduled at 3:30 p.m. Sunday, March 18, in the Community Arts auditorium of Wayne State University.


Proceeds from both concerts will be used toward a planned 300-bed teaching hospital to train nurses and doctors at Ewha and help Korea meet its critical shortage of medical personnel.

Mrs. Young Song Kim, of Farmington, president of the Ewha alumnae association in the Detroit area, has made the arrangements for both performances.

"We wanted to give people in our own area an opportunity to share in this event," she said, "and the staff of Nardin Park was most gracious in donating its facilities for the Monday concert."

Music of the kyo-keum, an instrument native to Korea, will be included in the concert program. Piano, vocal and dance numbers are on the program too.
