City Corrects Tax Address Notification

FARMINGTON
The City of Farmington is notifying 800 residents who were erroneously notified by Farmington Township that they do, indeed, live in the city.
The confusion was generated when 800 residents of Drakeshire and Chatham Hills apartments received notices from the township to fill out their income tax forms with a "Farmington Township" address, according to City Manager Robert Deadman.
The township was attempting to make sure they get their fair share of next year's federal shared revenue.
The federal government has notified municipal units the tax forms will be used to update the 1970 census figures, and used to allocate the shared revenue.
The township board authorized the township clerk to send out notices with instructions on how to fill out the tax forms to be sure the township got credit for its population.
This was followed by announcements from Quakertown and Wood Creek Farms to their residents, warning them not to confuse their village addresses with the township.
All four units of government share a common mailing address.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a special election will be held in Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland, and State of Michigan, on Monday, the 25th day of March, 1973, for the purpose of submitting the following proposition:

In order to renew the five mill operating tax increase which expired in 1972, shall the limitation of the total amount of general and ad valorem taxes which may be imposed for all purposes in any one year upon real and tangible personal property in Farmington Public School District, Oakland County, Michigan, be increased as provided in Section 6, Article IX, of the Constitution of Michigan, for a period of ten (10) years from 1973 to 1982, both inclusive, by five (5) mills on each dollar (\$5.00 per \$1,000) of assessed valuation of property as finally equated, for the purpose of defraying a part of the operation expense of the school district?
