City Commission Approves \$99,517 Budget For 1949-50

Buildings, Parking, Police Major Items

Quarantine Placed On All Stray Dogs

Rigid quarantine was placed on all dogs in this area last week by William Aiken, animal commissioner for Oakland County.

Aiken has instructed deputy dog warden James Ethier to pick up all dogs found running loose in the city and township limits.

The quarantine has been necessitated by an outbreak of rabies in the area. To date, in the Farmington area alone, there have been five dog bites reported.

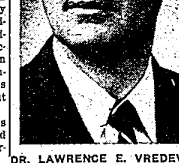
