The home is operated by Mrs. Gladys Malcolm and Mrs. Anna May Palmer. Both women are registered nurses with long experience. Mrs. Malcolm came from Harper Hospital and from Dr. E. G. Beauville and Dr. E. R. Sherin. Mrs. Palmer spent many years at Highland Park Hospital previous to opening the home.

The building, surrounded by shady pines and a cool, green lawn, is formerly owned by Doctor Gerald Wilson. The present management did but little alteration to the house.

## The Grist Mill

County Agricultural Agent Many farmers are finding that putting up grass silage this time of the year keeps the milk production up during the months of July and August. At that time, pastures dry up. Among those farmers putting up grass silage for dairy feed are Howard Beardsley of Oxford; Claude Zimmermann of Ortonville; Lloyd Virgin of Davisburg; Dr. Filan Morris of Pontiac; C. B. Longley of Farmington; and Vern Spencer of Walled Lake. Grass silage making takes experience and know-how, and farm magazines are carrying articles on how the job can be done. The County Extension Office will be glad to give you further information.

Bernard Carver of South Lyon was telling me the other day that he was able to get real milk production from Reed's Canary Grass pasture. He says that with 14 cows on 7 acres he hasn't been able to keep it down even in an up-to-now what has been a dry year. Farmers with wet low ground that can't be worked, should check on this.

Larry Tripp, Soil Conservationist, says that farmers are really putting to work soil and water conservation practices in their farms in Oakland County. This program, three years old now, is really doing a job on Oakland County's rolling land.

You horse lovers won't want to miss the horse pulling contest and draft horse show at Richmond, Michigan, Saturday, July 2. Looks like a good program.

Hunters wishing to camp in Michigan and hunt in Wisconsin next season will contact Michigan conservation department authorities for written permission to transport firearms and deer in Michigan while hunting in Wisconsin. 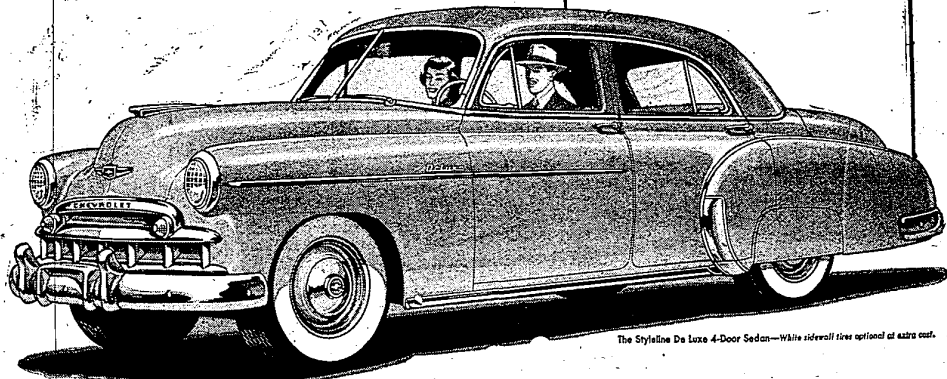
