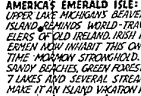

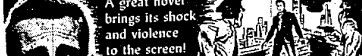

Houghton Lake Closed For Fish Spearfishing

Houghton lake is not open to taking fish with spears.

An error in a recent conservation department news release covering fish law changes voted by the 1949 legislature confused Houghton lake with Portage lake and ship canal in Houghton county, opened to spearfishing season under regulations in force for inland waters.

Although thousands of Fourth of July week end vacationists filtered into the upstate forest lands, nearly complete fire reports show that less than nine acres were burned in the last nine days, according to the conservation department.

Finish Blacktopping State Park Roads

Blacktopping of several state park roads has been completed, the conservation department's parks division announces.

Park visitors will find improved thoroughfares at Hayes, Sterling, Burt Lake, Hogmer 2 and May City in the lower peninsula. At Taberna Falls state park, a new entrance gravel road leading into the lower falls, a new parking area and some campground development is reported at this upper peninsula location by the parks division.

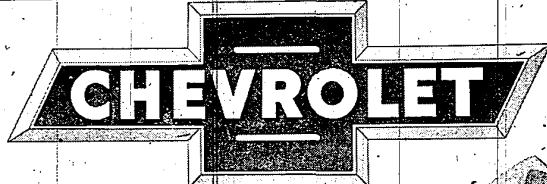

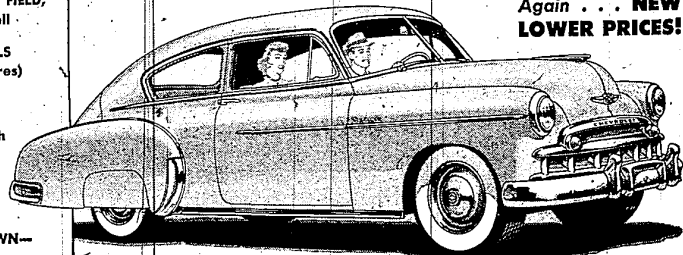
