No Reward Given For Marked Trout

The conservation department does not pay a \$2 reward for marked trout, as it does for fin-clipped lake trout planted in Lakes Michigan and Huron, but brook, brown and rainbow fishermen also are encouraged to report on their catches to the department's fish division.

Sport fishermen are advised that each keeper-sized trout planted in 1947 was marked by clipping of the big dorsal fin. The 1948 plant was marked by clipping the adipose fin, the little fin on the back just ahead of the tail. This year's hatchery trout are planted in lakes and streams unmarked, as in the years before the two-year test. Present evidence indicates that the carry-over of planted trout from one season to the next in Michigan streams is small.

For those cooperating sport fishermen who turn in the metal tags which they find attached to a number of species of planted fish, they will be given age, size and location of planting stated. If requested, the tag will be returned to the fisherman who may desire to keep it as a souvenir.
