

Issue Second Polio Warning

Six cases of infantile paralysis have occurred in Detroit so far this year, Dr. Bruce H. Douglas, commissioner of health, said this week. All of them were children under ten years of age and one little eight-year-old girl died of the disease on June 20.

The seasonal increase in infantile paralysis appears to be about three weeks ahead of the usual experience for Detroit. Dr. Douglas says it is too soon to predict whether the number of cases this year will be above or below the average. He suggests that parents should not be overly anxious about infantile paralysis and should not let anxiety or worry about it reach their children. Freedom from worry and a happy state of mind increase the child's chances for good health.

During the summer vacation season, the following precautions

should be observed:

Avoid over-fatigue, too active play, late hours, worry and irregular living schedules.

Avoid crowds and new contacts, and places where you may be close to persons who can cough and breathe on you.

Avoid swimming in water which has been declared unsafe, such as the Detroit River, except Belle Isle Beach.

Avoid bathing. Take off wet shoes and clothing.

Keep your hands clean. Wash them before you eat.

Keep garbage covered and free from flies and other insects.

Call a doctor at once for symptoms of headache, nausea, upset stomach, unexplained fever or muscular soreness or stiffness.

Infantile paralysis is one disease about which people are more frightened than the facts warrant. More than half of those who have the disease show no after-effects, and another quarter of those who have infantile paralysis recover with only slight crippling.

Warm Days Need Cold Drinks

Most urgent want on a hot summer day is a cool drink that is both thirst-quenching and refreshing. Many refreshing fruit drinks contain valuable vitamins and should be served often to both children and adults.

Popular combinations are oranges, lemons and grape juices; and raspberries, currant and lemon juices. A delicious punch may be made from lemon, orange and pineapple juices

with strawberry juice and fruit added. Gingerale in combination with fruit juices is refreshing.

Also there are the old favorites of iced tea and coffee as well as iced cocoa for the children.

Lemon or Limeade

Three to six lemons depending on desired strength, 3 cups of water. 1 to 1 1/2 cups syrup which is made of equal parts of sugar and water boiled 10 minutes. Lots of ice.

Orangeade

Use oranges, one lemon and one cup of syrup. Lots of ice and a garnish of mint leaves or cherries makes a colorful and pleasing beverage.

Ginger Ale Punch

To the juice of 4 lemons or 2 oranges and one orange, one pint of grape juice and syrup to taste, add a quart of ginger ale just before serving.

Add one quart of ginger ale to

the juice of four lemons and a pint of grape juice, sweetened to taste. Iced Tea Punch

Mix the juice of three lemons and two oranges and one cup of iced tea. Add 1 1/2 cup of sugar and a pint of water. A pint of ginger ale should be added just before serving.

The state's elk population is estimated at 150 to 300 and is concentrated in northern Otsego county.

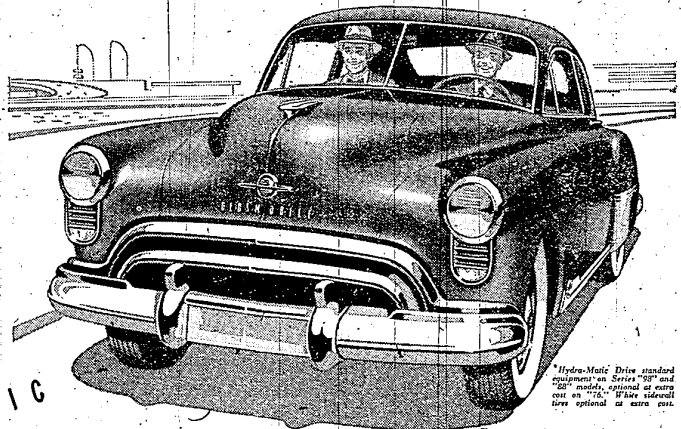
