Even A Trickle . . .

would be welcome these days to the residents of the southeastern section of Farmington Township. A trickle of what? — Water!

They have a water system, it's true, but that's where the word ends. The water system is a bath tub, or pails that must be filled late at night or early in the morning, if there is to be water in the house.

Last week the Farmington Township Board passed a necessary ordinance, designed to protect the health and welfare of the residents of the Township. That ordinance requires the installation of regulation flush toilets, except on farms of 5 acres or more. It is to be supposed that these toilets are meant to be flushed, and more than once or twice a day.

How is it going to be done where there is little or or water? The adoption of a health code is a progressive step forward in meeting a bad situation! It should, if carried out, do much to insure the health of all the people in the township. It should also speed along a solution to the inadequate water system in the Clarenceville area. There is a solution, somewhere.

The establishment of the system was approved by the Board in good faith and with the apparent assurance that it would adequately serve the area. But it has failed to work that way. Several efforts have been made to correct it, all to no avail. In the meanium, 500, users are paying for water they are not getting. The situation will get no better as time goes on unless action is taken.

This not only presents an extreme hardship on a large number of residents in a concentrated area, but the presents an unhealthful and unsanitary condition, the present same and the present same area involved. The system is already a heavy burden foot the user, the present same area involved. Any correcting measures will cost even more. The limit has also been reached, apparently, in trying to find an answer by local governmental officials. They have tried, but lost.

There is a solution, a solution that should be of concern to County and State health officers. There is a solution founded, if on nothing else, on giving 500 people service that they are paying for.




