Zoners Aiming For Orchard Lake Rd.

Residents in the neighborhood of Orchard Lake Road between 12 and 13 Mile Roads are the principal objectives of the township-wide Zoning Committee this week as the campaign to enroll more voters as supporters of zoning continues.

A meeting will be held tonight (Thursday) in the Orchard Lake Community Church, Greening Boulevard and Thirteen Mile Road, to which all persons in the neighborhood are invited and at which the objectives of the Zoning Committee will be explained.

George V. McLaughlin, president of the North Farmington District Civic Association, will be the speaker and after his address will throw the meeting open to questions and general discussion. The meeting is scheduled for 8 p.m.

Petitions are being circulated in this district by Emil Pyorala, 25855 Greening, Mrs. Edward E. Porter, 25755 Alyceway, and S. H. Kosmenko, 25804 Greening. Interested voters have been asked to get in touch with these members of the committee. Residents who are not voters and hence not eligible to sign the petitions may obtain instructions from these members about how, when and where to register.

Persons from other parts of the township who have not been able to attend previous zoning meetings and would like to have the program explained to them are equally welcome to attend tonight's meeting. The Zoning Committee is endeavoring to complete its township-wide canvass within the next two weeks. Present plans call for presenting the combined petitions to the Township Board at its August meeting.

A list of committee members and their addresses will be made public next week for the benefit of residents who for any reason or another have not been able to sign the petitions.

Two types of petition are being circulated. One requests the Township Board to set up an interim ordinance at once, to remain in effect until a permanent one can be enacted; the other requests a permanent Zoning Board be named and authorized to complete a permanent ordinance as provided by state law.
