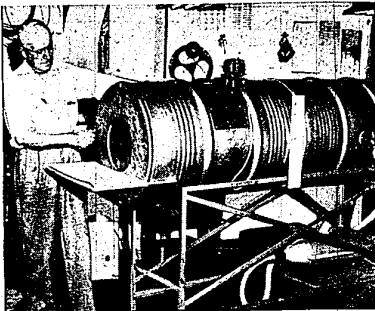
Sealed bids will be received by the City of Farmington for two separate jobs.

Jack Reichart, above, who manufactures tea kettles and colanders, responded to the emergency by converting his production lines to iron lungs like the one pictured above. Reichart and his men produced the first lung, made of two steel drums and a vacuum cleaner, in a matter of 10 hours. The device was rushed to the hospital and the boy's life was saved.

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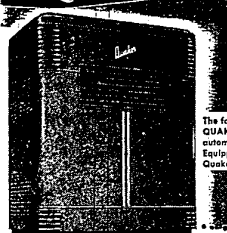

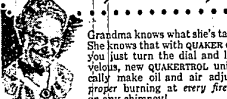
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
