PLAN FOR LARGE CROWD AT STATE 4-H CLUB SHOW

Michigan's greatest exhibit of rural youth accomplishment — the State 4-H Club Show at Michigan State College — is expected to draw record-breaking numbers of exhibitors and 4-H Club members to East Lansing this month. A. G. Kettunen, state leader of the new Agricultural Engineering Building, leaving added space in the Auditorium for more crops, flowers, garden and home economics exhibits.

The area beneath the seats in the new Macklin Stadium bowl was used for the first time last year to house beef cattle, dairy cattle, ewes and sheep and thousands of head will be shown there this fall.

Judging of exhibits will start on Wednesday, August 31, at which time demonstration teams, judging teams and other contestants will also compete. Special evening entertainment is being provided on both Wednesday and Thursday evenings for the youth by radio station WJR, Detroit, and the Prairie Farmer, Chicago.

Arrangements are being made to house and feed more than 1,500 of the visiting youths and leaders during the show at the museum village on the MSC campus.

"Our great desire is that we will have thousands of parents and friends come to East Lansing and see 4-H Club achievement at its best," Kettunen remarked, adding that the show is free to all.

I have a personal reason for believing this was true. However, it should also be noted that with the death of Justice Pierce Butler, a Catholic, in November, 1939, Roosevelt wanted a Catholic to take his place. Likewise, Robert H. Jackson, was being groomed for the presidency, and the White House wanted the justice department spotlight to play on him.

I am convinced, however, that the first factor—calling Murphy off the heels of the big-city bosses was the most important. And here is my reason for thinking so.

By this time — early in 1940 — most of the Louisiana scandals had been cleaned up and a grand jury was considering the indictment of Mayor Robert Maestri of New Orleans on a hot oil charge. Suddenly, Chief Prosecutor John Hodge was called out of the jury room to answer the telephone from Washington. Returning to the jury room, he suspended the grand jury proceedings.

Learning of this mysterious move, I went to Frank Murphy and asked for an explanation. Murphy told the truth. Mayor Maestri was not to be indicted, he said. He had received orders from the White House.

That was 1940 — a presidential year. In order to get the nomination, FDR needed the support of the big-city bosses, and in Louisiana, the only man who could deliver the delegation was Mayor Maestri.

Ironically, when Frank Murphy went up to the supreme court to be sworn in, he asked Felix Frankfurter to accompany him. Murphy had recommended Frankfurter's court appointment to the White House and they were close friends. But in a short time, however, they were bitter enemies. Frankfurter's scathing sarcasm hurt Murphy and they scarcely spoke. Murphy was also bitter against brain-truster Tom Corcoran, once his closest friend, but who he felt had conspired to block his prosecution of city bosses.

Ground Water Levels Continue To Fall

Below normal ground water levels continued again in July, measurements by conservation department hydrologists reveal, but the seasonal decline from June to July of .83 foot was the slightest of record. Last month's ground water stage of 210 feet is only .34 foot higher than the record low of 1925 of 176 feet. The July water level is .70 foot lower than the 10-year July average at 250 feet.

Brake and Keyes are ALL definitely interested in the nomination, we managed to stay neutral. Partisan politics have no place in this Main street column. But the inquiries do show an interest or anxiety of Republican observers about 1950.

Another point: Harry F. Kelly is a possible candidate. Would a "third term" issue lessen his proved popularity with Michigan voters? That is something for the hot-stove league to talk about this fall.

Cooperative efforts to curtail Michigan's highway traffic toll are beginning to bring dividends. For three consecutive months a decline in traffic deaths has taken place. Maxwell Halsey, executive secretary of the Michigan state safety commission, reports the next objective is to make highways more safe for children. "More than 4,500 children were killed or injured in

Michigan traffic accidents last year," says Halsey.

Does your community need a hospital? The Federal government will pay one-third of the cost of construction, providing the local community raises the other two-thirds. This aid is limited to about \$11 million dollars for Michigan.

Hugh J. McDoldrick, Williams-attorney director of the state office of hospital survey and construction, reports that seven projects are now under way and three more will break ground next fall. The ten hospitals and hospital additions will add 1,000 beds to Michigan's facilities.
