First Lieutenant William C. Carpenter, Jr., of 33430 Shawansee, was awarded the silver wings of a parachutist as well as a gliderman's silver wings at a ceremony held August 27 at Ft. Bragg, N. C.

Lt. Carpenter won his wings with the 82nd Airborne Division, training at Fort Bragg. Mrs. Carpenter, who had accompanied her husband to his previous station at Fort Benning, planned one set of wings on the lieutenant.

Lt. Carpenter was serving with the 10th Infantry Division at Fort Riley, Kansas, during the month of June. He served there as an instructor of basic trainees. Later, he was transferred to the Airborne Infantry of the 82nd Airborne Division, where he was part of an intensive two-month training program.

At the North Carolina station, Lt. Carpenter found several war-time buddies in his outfit.

Before returning to Michigan, where Lt. Carpenter will return to college, the Carpenters spent several days touring the Great Smoky mountains and Chattanooga, Tennessee.

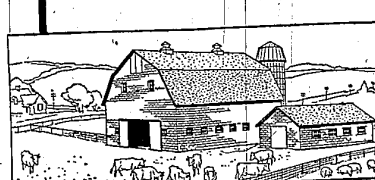
