DEADLOCK
Illustrative of the snafu state of congressional business is an unpublicized but long-standing deadlock between the house and senate over the army civil functions bill, since June 1, with no sign of a break in sight.

Cause of the deadlock is a 590 million dollar rivers and harbors rider that the senate wrote into the measure. This huge loan grab was not included in the President's budget. The fund would be spent by the army engineers, which have one of the most potent underdog lobbies in Washington.

Militant backers of the rider are Sens. John McClelland (D. Ark.), Pat McCarran (D. Nev.) and Chan Gurney (R. S. D.). McClelland is Congress, an army engineers lobbyist, and all three are economical.

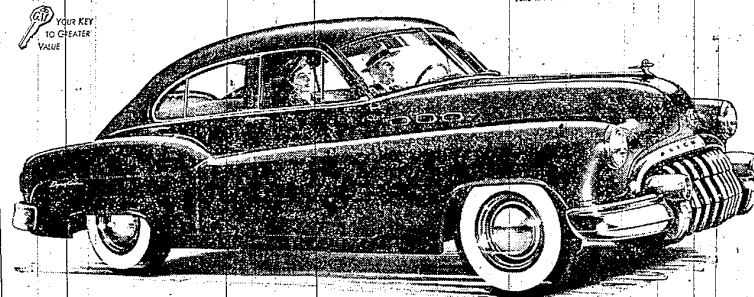
