Home Freezer Free? Housewife Says It Pays For Itself

(Editor's Note: Mrs. Bush has written the article at the request of The Enterprise to present a more clear picture of home freezing to homemakers interested in freezing their winter fruits and vegetables. The article will be run in serial form.)

The price of a home freezer may appear forbidding; but if that freezer is used correctly, the freezer will more than pay for itself in just a few seasons of use.

For instance, you can preserve and save all the surplus fruits and vegetables which might otherwise go to waste. Very few housewives want to "fire up" the pressure cooker for only a few plants of food. With a freezer, as little as one pint of food may be frozen at one time. Perhaps its leftovers that might otherwise go to waste; a single picking of beans, for instance, might be more than the family can eat at one meal. Top not into the freezer, where there have been waste becomes stored vegetables. Carried on through an entire harvest period, this system of saving leftovers can cut a month's produce in the cold chest.

Another way the freezer helps buy itself is in the purchase of food. Fruits, vegetables, and meat can be purchased at the peak of the season, when overabundance causes depressed prices. Right now, farmers have been culling their chicken flocks to remove poor producers. Those are fine for freezing, and can generally be purchased cheaper at this time of year.

Bought cheaply, foods can be stored safely for long periods of time. Ground meat, for example, can be kept for a year. (not counting sausage, which keeps six months), smoked meat three to six months, poultry, a year. Even some varieties of fish and dairy products can be stored for a year.

Fruits and vegetables, when bought cheaply at the height of the season and properly preserved, can be kept for a year. And retain all their fresh flavor, too.

CHOOSING THE FREEZER

Choosing the exact home freezer for your purposes isn't an easy task and certainly should not be the result of snap judgment.

What size freezer is probably the most important point. Remember, a freezer isn't meant to store only a few week's supply of foods; it can and will take care of most of the family's fruit, vegetable, meat and pastries when well-planned.

Experience has shown me that at least three cubic feet of space is needed for each member of the family — and that includes small children.

Therefore, a family of four will

He was supposed to sponsor "compromise" legislation in the senate. But after examining the bills agreed on at secret conferences with California, Texas and Louisiana officials, O'Mahoney refused to have anything to do with them.

Hearings on the measures were scheduled before a house judiciary subcommittee, headed by Rep. Francis E. Walter (D., Pa.).

One of the measures is an out-and-out grab. It would give the states the bulk of these vast oil reserves.

Democrats is the prospect that the real answers to these controversies must come from the State Supreme court itself. For example, it was argued at the civil service commission hearing on the Kungz case that the liquor control commission had full authority to abolish any post even though the post had been created by the civil service commission.

George J. Burke, member of the civil service commission, replied: "Do you mean that the authority of civil service ends with the creation of a new position? What would stop any other department from following the precedent you are attempting to set here?"

In the highway department case the attorney general's ruling is challenged by a state-elected official, the state highway commissioner.

These are constitutional questions, made to order for the State Supreme court.

In the meanwhile, they serve to focus attention again on the role of the Michigan governor — whether he be Republican Kim Sigler or Democrat G. Mennen Williams — with respect to responsibility and power.
