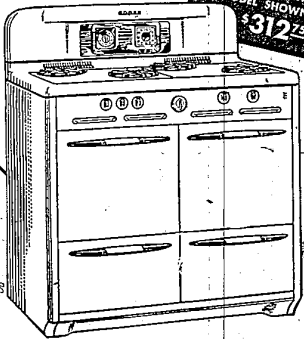

Fruits And Vegetables Star In This Week's Freezer Rules

(Editor's Note: Mrs. Bush has written this article at the request of The Enterprise to present a more clear picture of home freezing to homemakers interested in freezing their winter fruits and vegetables. The article will be run in serial form.)

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES
Most vegetables may be frozen, with the exception of artichokes, onions, celery, radishes; cabbage, green pepper and raw tomatoes. Most other vegetables require blanching prior to freezing. Follow this procedure for all vegetables:

Use a colander or cheesecloth bag. Place cleaned and picked vegetables in it, and submerge into a large kettle containing at least a gallon of vigorously boiling water. Start timing when the water returns to boiling.

When time (according to the chart) has expired, plunge immediately into a large container of ice water or running cold water. Cool for not over one minute. Then drain well, package and seal.

For best results, prepare and freeze at once. This doesn't take much time. For instance, a peck of snap beans may be picked, prepared and freezing in two hours or less.

BLANCHING CHART
ASPARAGUS, cut into tips or 1" pieces, scald 3 minutes.

BEANS (GREEN) 1 1/2" pieces, scald 5 minutes.

BEANS (WAX) 1 1/2" pieces, 2 minutes.

BEANS (Lima) Baby Lima, shell-ed, 2 1/2 minutes; large shelled, 4 1/2 minutes.

BROCCOLI, soak in salt water 1/2 hour, cut to fit package, 4 minutes.

BRUSSEL SPROUTS, soak in salt water 1/2 hour, pack whole, 4 minutes.

CARROTS, Diced or sliced, shooting or small whole, 3 minutes.

CAULIFLOWER, 1 1/2 inch thick pieces, 3 1/2 minutes.

CELERY (for cooking) 1" or 2" pieces, 2 minutes.

CORN (whole kernel) cut from cobs, 5 minutes.

about half of what had been anticipated. The state had met all payrolls on time. The treasurer had merely borrowed from other funds. Unemployment was high in 1938 due to a recession. Governor Murphy called the legislature into special session to appropriate more money for welfare aid. A sum of \$10,000,000 was authorized — in the face of an existing deficit. No new taxes were levied.

Frank Fitzgerald campaigned for economy in state government. He asked a \$9,250,000 increase in the state payroll during the Murphy administration. The CIO sit-down strike had evoked strong public resentment. Fitzgerald called on this, too. Murphy lost the election and later was sent by President Roosevelt to the Philippines and then to the United States Supreme Court.

If state government could meet payrolls in 1938 with red ink on its books, it seems logical to us that we can do so in 1950. Why then all this letter writing in September, 1949? President Truman said he opened the 1950 political campaign with his Labor Day speeches at Pittsburgh and Des Moines. The same might be said about Governor Williams' letters.

The Michigan gubernatorial campaign is already under way. Not the voters who want 78 percent of state sales tax revenue for schools, cities and townships. No, no! The "villain" will be the new choice (1) a Republican legislature which declines to tax corporation profits; (2) a Democratic governor who insists on more state aid for everyone, especially for members of the CIO.

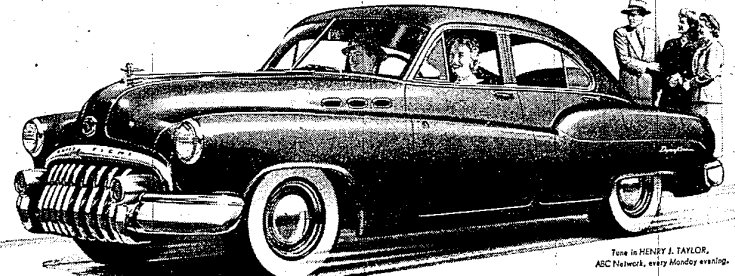
