Indian Shoots 11 Year Old Duck


An adult black duck tagged and released in October, 1948, at the conservation department's Manitowish bay landing station has been reported shot by the Hudson Bay company. In returning the tag to the department's game division, the company advised the 11-year old bird was shot by an Indian at Lac Seul, Ontario.

Game division banding records indicate as high as 30 per cent of tagged black ducks released from this station are shot the same year released. The 11 year old black duck is one of the oldest of game division record.
