ROAD SUBDIVISIONS

BOARD TO STUDY

Before any final action is taken, however, more detailed surveys must be made. The Oakland County Road Commission has agreed, according to Blanchard, to do the engineering and free of charge. The actual construction work will probably be done by private contractors on a bid basis.
