Carrots Gain Food Value In Storage

Carrot marketing with a new look and offering higher food value is gaining favor in Michigan. Increasing quantities are being marketed with tops off and packed in cellophane bags. Packaging begins with freshly harvested carrots and continues throughout the winter with roots from storage.

R. L. Carnie, research horticulturist at Michigan State College says that carrots stored properly will actually be better in quality and higher in food value.

Back-End Bumps Smash Six Cars

Six vehicles were damaged early this week in a sudden epidemic of rear-end collisions. Three such accidents were reported Sunday and Monday. Six vehicles were involved, one man was injured, and two traffic summons were issued.

At 1:50 p.m. Sunday, at Grand River and Hawthorne, a car driven by Earl Lee Wright, of Detroit, collided with the rear of a truck driven by Norman S. Balone, of 2216 E. Farmington.

Balone's truck, owned by the Smith-Zuppper Lumber company, was parked at the curb when the accident occurred. The physician who treated Wright for lacerations about the face stated Wright was in a condition of fatigue.

Robert E. White, of Detroit, was summoned to appear before Judge Schutte after a collision at 7 p.m. Sunday. White's car collided with one being driven by Clayton Goers, Jr., of 21416 Roosevelt. According to Farmington City Police, Goers had slowed to allow a car to turn off Grand River at Nine Mile Road. White was ticketed for not having his car under control and following too closely.

The cars were locked together by the impact and had to be towed away. No one was injured, however. In the third accident, Harvey Irwin Boyd, 65, of Detroit, was ticketed for failure to have his car under control. Police reports stated Boyd was traveling east on Grand River when his car collided with another car belonging to Ned Arthur Hickey, of Riverside Cables. Hickey's car was parked on Grand River between Pickett and Wilmar Streets.

Another business moved into Farmington's downtown section last Wednesday when Phil Thomas, 26-year old ex-G.I., set up his watchmaker's bench at the Grimes Dry Cleaning shop.
