models operated by the stand, the Hallowes Six is the latest in the way of witch's brooms.

For greater riding comfort, as well as a place for the passenger to sit, an auxiliary broom has been added to the main broom forming the main unit. (Witches' broom pushroom is also easier to control.) Six sparkplugs are mounted in the rear, as well as a tall light and license plate. A headlight, two side lights, fanelet, fan and battery are also mounted on the broom. An oil filter, presumably for filtering the witch's brew, is also part of the strange contrivance. The driver holds the meter, an indispensable part of any taxi.

The idea of witches riding brooms originated with the Druids in 1936. The Roman Empire, roughly 1500 years ago. The Druid custom claimed October 31 as the day when all the spirits and witches were abroad. The custom held over the years as a time, when it became a part of the ritual preceding All Hallow's, or All Saints Day, November 1. The day before All Hallow's Day, however, was shortened into Hallowe'en by constant use.

More than witches will be around on October 31, however. There are dances and parties planned all over Farmington. Floral Park is to hold a street dance at 7 p.m., October 31, the Farmington American Legion is having a dance on October 29, and the Novi AmVets will entertain October 29 at Meadowbrook Inn.
