But on the first Northville play Al Simcheck recovered a Mustang fumble to put Clarenceville in scoring position but they were unable to get anywhere as the Northville defense tightened.

Neither team threatened again until the closing minutes of the game. With the Mustangs in possession of the ball on their own 43 yard line, Dickerson attempted to pass for Northville. Dale Pound intercepted on the 25 yard line and raced 71 yards to the Northville four yard line before he was brought down. Three plays later Pound broke over for six points and the Trojans took the lead for the first time. Grose's conversion attempt was blocked. Northville took to the air in the final period but was unable to break through the Trojan defense.

## Chinchilla

(Continued from Page One) Township. Originally starting with only two of the little animals in 1946, the Kelsch chinchilla ranch has increased to 17. The Kelschs are trying to increase their flock to the point where they can start raising the animals for their fur. This is the reason for the chinchilla in the first place.

The chinchilla has a wonderfully soft and silky coat, much in demand by furriers with high price tags (a coat Aly Kahn gave Rita recently cost \$30,000). The reason for the chinchilla's softness is the great number of soft, fine hairs the little creature grows. Where as a human has only one hair to each follicle (one too many at shaving time), the chinchilla has 80 to 100.

Despite the high price tag for a mature 24-ounce chinchilla, the Kelschs maintain they make fine pets, and don't take a lot of work, either. They are fed special alfalfa pellets, greens, raisins, toasted peanuts, and sometimes get an apple twig to gnaw on. When they aren't fed on time, they're likely to cut loose with a bark sounding much like a seal, but on a smaller scale.

The chinchilla was originally a South American animal peculiar to the Andes mountains. Weighing only an ounce and a half when born, with their eyes open, they mature in 18 months to a heft of 24 ounces.

Chinchillas are born in groups of one to five, although one is the usual litter. The Kelschs have been lucky — they have had triplets three times. Unlike dogs and cats, the chinchilla is mated for life and kept in pairs which sell for \$150 and up.

The Kelschs claim the chinchilla is a neat animal that eats with its paws in the manner of squirrel,

(and humans). Yes, they could even be housebroken, Mrs. Kelsch claims. And they don't need bathing — they dry clean their own fur dully with sand.

But they can be fuzzy, too. Young chinchillas get orange juice for their vitamin "C", and have their diet supplemented with canned milk diluted with water. A nocturnal animal, the chinchilla sleeps during the day and plays at night, exercising on squirrel wheels in their cages.

Which is a factor to consider if thinking of adopting one as a pet for the children, even if the price tag isn't enough to discourage you.

If it proves impossible to deliver this sum to the Clarenceville commission, then the excess will be divided between participating groups on a percentage basis, depending on the size of their original budgets.
