The medium size ones is 65c a dozen and the large ones is 75c. Fer them fresh eggs you should oughtta have sliced bacon. We got that, too, fer 49c a lb. You taste it and see if we like it — then you tell us Thursday when you see us at the Fair, huh?

tense tightened. The kick went out of bounds on the Falcon thirty-six. Yankee picked up two yards. After Plum lost one, Yankee pointed out to the 49-yard line. Acord picked up seven yards and then three more, making it a first down on the 39-yard line. Blackwell went down the left side of the field all the way to the five before he was knocked out of bounds by Barrons. Then Schneider went over his own left tackle for the touchdown. The kick was good; Berkeley led 14 to 0.

The kickoff and an exchange of punts ended the half.

Berkeley's remaining touchdown occurred in the final quarter. The first came when a long punt went deep into Farmington territory where it was picked up by Rupp, who was hit in his own one-yard line. The Falcon kick was bad, going down to the fifteen. After moving the ball to the Falcon four, Oswald went over. Since the kick was good, the score stood Berkeley 21 - Farmington 0.

Late in the period a fumble on the Farmington thirty was recovered by Berkeley. A pass from Oswald to Pfister put the pigskin in the end zone. With Spicer's boot between the uprights, the score stood Berkeley 25 - Farmington 0.

Farmington took to the air but to no avail. The gun sounded, closing down the 1949 football season for Farmington High School. The Falcons ended the season with a record of five victories against three defeats.
