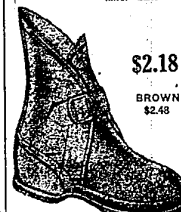

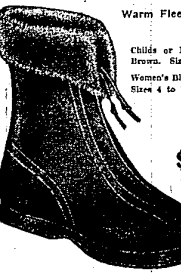

- 7 Change transmission lubricants to winter grade.
- 8 Change rear axle lubricants to winter grade.
- 9 Readjust carburetor for winter driving.
- 10 Clean, space and test spark plugs.
- 11 Inspect fan belt—adjust if necessary.
- 12 Clean and tighten battery cables and connections.
- 13 Check hydraulic brake master cylinder fluid.
- 14 Safety check—lights, horn, windshield wipers and brakes.
