"Children Tomorrow's Leaders" Governor's Wife Tells P.T.A.

Children of today are the good leaders of the bad leaders of tomorrow," Mrs. G. Mennen Williams told the Farmington P.T.A. Tuesday evening.

Mrs. Williams made it clear to her audience that the Governor will continue to fight to have his recommendations pass the State Legislature. She said that the Governor had recommended a minimum teacher salary, a teachers' retirement fund financed from the general fund and not from school funds, and a pupil-teacher ratio in the classroom not to exceed 35 to 1, this ratio to be reduced during a five year period to 30 to 1. The Governor feels, she said, that there should be an absolute limit to the number of pupils in each class.

Mrs. Williams discussed the proposal that the entrance age of children be reduced. She said that the Governor did not feel such action would be wise, but that such entrance would be determined by individual ability instead.

Governor Williams will cooperate with P.T.A. members or other individuals or groups and will welcome suggestions that will help to make this state one of the finest," his wife said. "We want to make our State better for future generations."

A musical program under the direction of Mr. J. W. Henderson, vocal music teacher, preceded Mrs. Williams' informal talk. Shirley Gibbs opened the program with a vocal solo "Thanks Be To God". Rosamund LeMieux gave a piano rendition of "Meditation" and Kenneth Siler, accompanied by his mother, presented a trumpet solo "Waltz - My Regards". "Viva" and "In The Gloaming" were presented by an 8th grade vocal group, the Junior Falconaires.

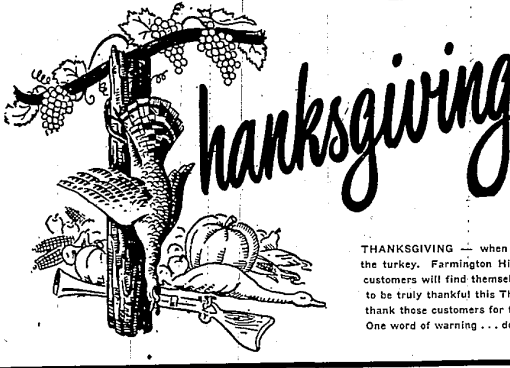

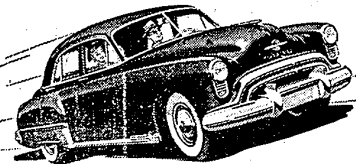

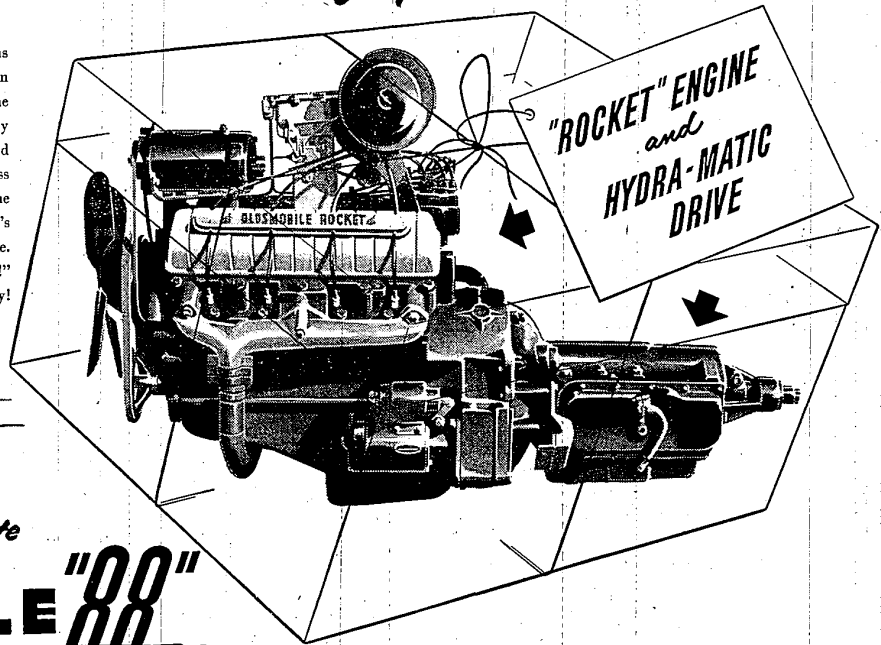
